We celebrate Christmas because of Jesus' birth. Can you sing a birthday song to Jesus?




Winter is the time when we celebrate Christmas.

Do you know that no two snowflakes are exactly alike? But there are two matching snowflakes on this page! Which ones are they?





Can you put these pictures in order? Write a number in each box to show the correct order.






The leaves fall down, and we rake them into big piles.




Celebrate the harvest! from Exodus 34:22

Summer is a good time for listening to night sounds. Who says, "Who-who?" Color the spaces with one dot to see who's calling you.




Connect the stars. What do you see?

Summer is a good time to look at the night sky. "Each star is different in its beauty."


